State of Rhode Island Monthly Hotel Report FY 2011 1.0 Percent Local Collections January 2011

Beginning in June 2010, the Rhode Island Department of Revenue will issue a report on the collection and distribution of the 1.0 percent local Hotel Tax. The report is meant to be descriptive and does not purport to project or assess the collection of the 1.0 percent local Hotel Tax. The report will provide data, by municipality, on the month-to-month, the year-over-year, and the fiscal year-to-date collections. A discussion of the municipalities with the largest and smallest percentage changes in these three measures will be included in the body of the report.

Analysis of Month-to-Month Collections

On a statewide basis, January 2011 local hotel tax collections totaled \$112,656 or 3.3 percent more than the \$109,044 collected in December 2010. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local hotel tax collections between January 2011 and December 2010 were: Woonsocket, 1,152.3 percent; New Shoreham, 141.6 percent; East Providence, 77.6 percent; East Greenwich, 40.6 percent; and Lincoln, 35.8 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local hotel tax collections between January 2011 and December 2010 were: West Greenwich, -73.5 percent; Richmond, -61.4 percent; Narragansett, -34.9 percent; Cranston, -27.6 percent; and Bristol, -25.8 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local hotel tax collections between January 2011 and December 2010 were: Providence, \$2,523; Warwick, \$1,769; Woonsocket, \$1,092; Middletown, \$818; and Lincoln, \$721. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local hotel tax collections between January 2011 and December 2010 were: Newport, -\$1,366; West Greenwich, -\$1,348; Smithfield, -\$950; Westerly, -\$341; and Pawtucket, -\$266.

Analysis of Year-over-Year Collections by Month

On a statewide basis, January 2011 local hotel tax collections totaled \$112,656 or 18.6 percent more than the \$94,968 collected in January 2010. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local hotel tax collections between January 2011 and January 2010 were:

Jamestown, 556.5 percent; Westerly, 190.1 percent; Newport, 87.6 percent; East Providence, 71.4 percent; and Glocester, 66.8 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local hotel tax collections between January 2011 and January 2010 were: East Greenwich, -79.9 percent; West Greenwich, -69.4 percent; Johnston, -49.4 percent; Richmond, -38.1 percent; and New Shoreham, -32.4 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local hotel tax collections between January 2011 and January 2010 were: Newport, \$13,450; Middletown, \$1,917; Providence, \$1,515; Westerly, \$864; and Smithfield, \$684. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local hotel tax collections between January 2011 and January 2010 were: Warwick, -\$1,918; West Greenwich, -\$1,098; New Shoreham, -\$264; Johnston, -\$190; and North Kingstown, -\$60.

Analysis of Fiscal Year-to-Date Collections through January

On a statewide basis, fiscal year-to-date January 2011 local hotel tax collections totaled \$1.72 million or 12.2 percent more than the \$1.54 million collected in fiscal year-to-date January 2010. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date January 2011 and fiscal year-to-date January 2010 were: Little Compton, 90.4 percent; Westerly, 76.9 percent; Charlestown, 52.0 percent; Smithfield, 23.0 percent; and Coventry, 22.8 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decreases in local hotel collections between fiscal year-to-date January 2011 and fiscal year-to-date January 2010 were: Cranston, -76.9 percent; Johnston, -21.0 percent; Foster, -14.1 percent; North Kingstown, -1.9 percent; and Pawtucket, -1.8 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date January 2011 and fiscal year-to-date January 2010 were: Newport, \$63,393; Providence, \$43,700; Westerly, \$40,345; Warwick, \$11,219; and Middletown, \$6,289. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date January 2011 and fiscal year-to-date January 2010 were: Cranston, -\$5,929; Johnston, -\$407; Pawtucket, -\$199; North Kingstown, -\$78; and Jamestown, -\$37.
