# State of Rhode Island Quarterly Cannabis Tax Distribution Report FY 2024 Local 3% Collections April 2024

Effective December 1, 2022, medical marijuana retailers were allowed to begin sales of adult use cannabis on which is imposed a local 3% excise tax. The data contained in this report is for the month in which the cannabis tax was distributed to the municipality by the Division of Taxation. Each distribution is for tax collections in the prior three months. The sales activity that generated the tax generally occurs in the month prior to when it is collected by Taxation. For example, cannabis tax generated from December sales activity is collected by Taxation in January and included in the April distribution report. Revenue is distributed to the municipality where the cannabis is delivered to the customer.

As the first distribution after implementation of the tax was in April 2023, there are no differences between April 2023 and FY 2023 year-to-date collections.

The findings of the April 2024 Local 3% Cannabis Tax Distribution Report on a statewide basis are summarized in the table below:
