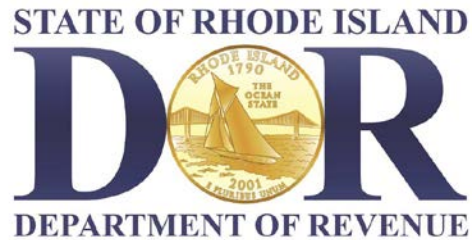

State of Rhode Island Monthly Local Hotel Tax Report
FY 2017 Local 1.0 Percent Collections November 2016

In June 2010, the Rhode Island Department of Revenue began issuing a monthly report on the collection and distribution of the local 1.0 percent hotel tax. The report is meant to be descriptive and does not purport to project or assess the collection of the local 1.0 percent hotel tax. The report provides data by municipality on the month-to-month, year-over-year, and fiscal year-to-date over fiscal year-to-date collections. A discussion of the municipalities with the largest and smallest percentage and nominal changes in these three measures will be included in the body of the report. It should be noted that late payments and adjustments generated by hotel activity in prior months may be included in this report.

Expansion of the Local Hotel Tax Base to Vacation Rentals and Hosting Platforms

Effective July 1, 2015, the reselling of lodging by online travel companies, the unlicensed rental of accommodations via internet platforms and other media, and vacation home rentals became subject to the local 1.0 percent hotel tax. For FY 2017, the hotel tax collections generated by these local hotel tax base expansion components are supposed to be distributed monthly by the Department of Revenue's Division of Taxation and the City of Newport. These figures are included in the month-to-month, year-over-year, and fiscal year-to-date over fiscal year-to-date collections for all municipalities to the extent they are available.

For FY 2016, the Division of Taxation made two distributions of the local hotel tax revenues that were generated by the expansion of the local hotel tax base. These distributions were made to all municipalities except the City of Newport. The first distribution for FY 2016 was for taxable rental activity that occurred between July 1, 2015 and December 31, 2015, inclusive. These figures will be included in the analysis of fiscal year-to-date over fiscal year-to-date collections for FY 2016 for all municipalities other than the City of Newport beginning in the December 2016 local hotel tax report. The second distribution was for taxable rental activity that occurred between January 1, 2016 and June 30, 2016, inclusive. These figures will be included in the analysis of fiscal year-to-date over fiscal year-to-date collections for FY 2016 for all municipalities other than the City

of Newport in the June 2017 local hotel tax report. The City of Newport began distributing the local hotel tax revenues from the base expansion on a monthly basis on July 1, 2015. These figures are included in the month-to-month, year-over-year, and fiscal year-to-date over fiscal year-to-date collections for FY 2017 and FY 2016.

The Office of Revenue Analysis (ORA) has provided a breakdown of the local hotel tax base expansion components in the “Rhode Island 1.0% Local Hotel Tax Report: November 2016 Collections by Component”, “Rhode Island 1.0% Local Hotel Tax Report: October 2016 Collections by Component”, and “Rhode Island 1.0% Local Hotel Tax Report: FY 2017 Year-to-Date Collections by Component” tables. The City of Newport did not provide a breakdown of the local hotel tax base expansion components for July through September 2016 as requested. Thus, ORA was unable to include this information in the tables, and all collections from the City of Newport that were generated by the local 1.0 percent hotel tax during that period are listed under traditional hotels. The City of Newport did provide a breakdown of the local hotel tax expansion components for October and November 2016 and those figures are included in the hosting platforms and room resellers and realtors and homeowners columns for October 2016, November 2016, and FY 2017 year-to-date as appropriate. The Division of Taxation did not report hotel tax component data for October or November 2016. The local hotel tax collection figures for October and November 2016 for all municipalities except the City of Newport include only receipts from traditional hotels. FY 2017 year-to-date figures for all municipalities except the City of Newport for hosting platforms and room resellers and realtors and homeowners include only hotel tax receipts from July 2016 through September 2016.

Analysis of Month-to-Month Collections

On a statewide basis, November 2016 local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections totaled \$233,232, 34.7 percent or \$123,665 less than the \$356,897 collected for October 2016. November 2016 local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections include \$4,555 of reported collections from the expansion of the local 1.0 percent hotel tax base. This compares to \$6,645 reported for October 2016. The four communities with percentage increases and five communities with the largest percentage decreases in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections on a month-to-month basis were:

Analysis of Year-over-Year Collections by Month

On a statewide basis, November 2016 local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections totaled \$233,232, \$18,146 or 8.4 percent more than the \$215,086 collected in November 2015. November 2016 local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections include \$4,555 from the expansion of the local 1.0 percent hotel tax base in November 2016. This compares to \$1,686 reported in November 2015. The five communities with the largest percentage increases / decreases in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections for November 2016 versus November 2015 were:

Analysis of Fiscal Year-to-Date over Fiscal Year-to-Date Collections

On a statewide basis, fiscal year-to-date November 2016 local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections totaled \$2.4 million, \$293,950 or 13.8 percent more than the \$2.1 million collected for fiscal year-to-date November 2015. Fiscal year-to-date November 2016 local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections include \$237,155 from the expansion of the local 1.0 percent hotel tax base. This compares to \$13,155 reported for fiscal year-to-date November 2015. The five communities with the largest percentage increases / decreases in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections for fiscal year-to-date November 2016 versus fiscal year-to-date November 2015 are listed below:
