State of Rhode Island Monthly Hotel Report FY 2011 1.0 Percent Local Collections April 2011

Beginning in June 2010, the Rhode Island Department of Revenue will issue a report on the collection and distribution of the 1.0 percent local Hotel Tax. The report is meant to be descriptive and does not purport to project or assess the collection of the 1.0 percent local Hotel Tax. The report will provide data, by municipality, on the month-to-month, the year-over-year, and the fiscal year-to-date collections. A discussion of the municipalities with the largest and smallest percentage changes in these three measures will be included in the body of the report.

Analysis of Month-to-Month Collections

On a statewide basis, April 2011 local hotel tax collections totaled \$149,121 or 10.2 percent more than the \$135,323 collected in March 2011. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local hotel tax collections between April 2011 and March 2011 were: Little Compton, 1,003.9 percent; North Kingstown, 479.1 percent; Narragansett, 351.7 percent Glocester, 150.9 percent; and Portsmouth, 124.9 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local hotel tax collections between April 2011 and March 2011 were: Johnston, -93.7 percent; West Greenwich, -20.7 percent; West Warwick, -17.5 percent; Lincoln, -12.2 percent; and Woonsocket, -8.4 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local hotel tax collections between April 2011 and March 2011 were: Middletown, \$5,347; Newport, \$3,731; Smithfield, \$2,602; Narragansett, \$2,362; and Westerly, \$1,627. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local hotel tax collections between April 2011 and March 2011 were: Providence, -\$3,733; West Greenwich, -\$661; West Warwick, -\$560; Lincoln, -\$397; and Johnston, -\$264.

Analysis of Year-over-Year Collections by Month

On a statewide basis, April 2011 local hotel tax collections totaled \$149,121 or 7.9 percent less than the \$161,859 collected in April 2010. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local hotel tax collections between April 2011 and April 2010 were: Little Compton,

603.2 percent; Narragansett, 304.9 percent; North Kingstown, 234.2 percent; East Greenwich, 145.2 percent; and Smithfield, 132.4 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local hotel tax collections between April 2011 and April 2010 were: Johnston, -94.7 percent; Charlestown, -48.2 percent; Westerly, -42.8 percent; West Warwick, -36.8 percent; and Warwick, -36.0 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local hotel tax collections between April 2011 and April 2010 were: Smithfield, \$3,591; Narragansett, \$2,284; Providence, \$2,073; Little Compton, \$705; and North Kingstown, \$525. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local hotel tax collections between April 2011 and April 2010 were: Warwick, -\$14,691; Newport, -\$2,734; Westerly, -\$2,427; West Warwick, -\$1,539; and West Greenwich, -\$651.

Analysis of Fiscal Year-to-Date Collections through April

On a statewide basis, fiscal year-to-date April 2011 local hotel tax collections totaled \$2.11 million or 9.6 percent more than the \$1.93 million collected in fiscal year-to-date April 2010. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date April 2011 and fiscal year-to-date April 2010 were: Westerly, 67.7 percent; Little Compton, 65.8 percent; Charlestown, 42.9 percent; Smithfield, 32.2 percent; and East Greenwich, 31.8 percent. The four communities with percentage decreases in local hotel collections between fiscal year-to-date April 2011 and fiscal year-to-date April 2010 were: Cranston, -66.9 percent; Foster, -55.5 percent; Johnston, -17.1 percent; and Pawtucket, -5.9 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date April 2011 and fiscal year-to-date April 2010 were: Providence, \$55,009; Newport, \$51,931; Westerly, \$40,071; Smithfield, \$10,260; and Coventry, \$5,530. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date April 2011 and fiscal year-to-date April 2010 were: Cranston, -\$5,154; Pawtucket, -\$924; Johnston, -\$478; Foster, -\$75; and Hopkinton, -\$6.
