State of Rhode Island Monthly Hotel Report FY 2011 1.0 Percent Local Collections June 2011

Beginning in June 2010, the Rhode Island Department of Revenue will issue a report on the collection and distribution of the 1.0 percent local Hotel Tax. The report is meant to be descriptive and does not purport to project or assess the collection of the 1.0 percent local Hotel Tax. The report will provide data, by municipality, on the month-to-month, the year-over-year, and the fiscal year-to-date collections. A discussion of the municipalities with the largest and smallest percentage changes in these three measures will be included in the body of the report.

Analysis of Month-to-Month Collections

On a statewide basis, June 2011 local hotel tax collections totaled \$220,158 or 18.1 percent less than the \$268,816 collected in May 2011. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local hotel tax collections between June 2011 and May 2011 were: Jamestown, 93.4 percent; Newport, 74.5 percent; Pawtucket, 25.9 percent; Scituate, 23.8 percent; and North Kingstown, 21.4 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local hotel tax collections between June 2011 and May 2011 were: Johnston, -96.6 percent; Woonsocket, -95.5 percent; Coventry, -78.7 percent; East Greenwich, -77.1 percent; and Westerly, -70.1 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local hotel tax collections between June 2011 and May 2011 were: Newport, \$27,039; Pawtucket, \$502; North Kingstown, \$446; Smithfield, \$267; and Jamestown, \$263. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local hotel tax collections between June 2011 and May 2011 were: Providence, -\$35,506; Westerly, -\$9,503; Lincoln, -\$6,986; Warwick, -\$6,166; and Coventry, -\$4,288.

Analysis of Year-over-Year Collections by Month

On a statewide basis, June 2011 local hotel tax collections totaled \$220,158 or 16.7 percent less than the \$264,387 collected in June 2010. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local hotel tax collections between June 2011 and June 2010 were: North Kingstown,

276.9 percent; Smithfield, 64.5 percent; Narragansett, 30.0 percent; Bristol, 27.0 percent; and Jamestown, 21.8 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local hotel tax collections between June 2011 and June 2010 were: Little Compton, -99.3 percent; Johnston, -97.2 percent; Woonsocket, -90.7 percent; Coventry, -68.0 percent; and Portsmouth, -62.4 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local hotel tax collections between June 2011 and June 2010 were: Smithfield, \$2,004; North Kingstown, \$1,861; Narragansett, \$972; West Greenwich, \$415; and Bristol, \$376. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local hotel tax collections between June 2011 and June 2010 were: Providence, -\$13,122; Middletown, -\$10,066; Newport, -\$5,271; Westerly, -\$4,688; and Lincoln, -\$3,295.

Analysis of Fiscal Year-to-Date Collections through June

On a statewide basis, fiscal year-to-date June 2011 local hotel tax collections totaled \$2.60 million or 9.2 percent more than the \$2.38 million collected in fiscal year-to-date June 2010. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date June 2011 and fiscal year-to-date June 2010 were: North Kingstown, 69.4 percent; Westerly, 64.2 percent; Charlestown, 43.1 percent; East Greenwich, 42.1 percent; and Smithfield, 33.5 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local hotel collections between fiscal year-to-date June 2011 and fiscal year-to-date June 2010 were: Cranston, -57.2 percent; Foster, -45.3 percent; Johnston, -16.9 percent; Pawtucket, -5.0 percent; and Middletown, -0.3 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date June 2011 and fiscal year-to-date June 2010 were: Providence, \$62,694; Newport, \$57,294; Westerly, \$45,673; Smithfield, \$13,065; and New Shoreham, \$7,064. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date June 2011 and fiscal year-to-date June 2010 were: Cranston, -\$4,407; Pawtucket, -\$1,003; Middletown, -\$670; Johnston, -\$586; and Foster, -\$61.
