State of Rhode Island Monthly Hotel Report FY 2012 1.0 Percent Local Collections August 2011

Beginning in June 2010, the Rhode Island Department of Revenue will issue a report on the collection and distribution of the 1.0 percent local Hotel Tax. The report is meant to be descriptive and does not purport to project or assess the collection of the 1.0 percent local Hotel Tax. The report will provide data, by municipality, on the month-to-month, the year-over-year, and the fiscal year-to-date collections. A discussion of the municipalities with the largest and smallest percentage changes in these three measures will be included in the body of the report.

Analysis of Month-to-Month Collections

On a statewide basis, August 2011 local hotel collections totaled \$405,091 or 16.4 percent more than the \$347,955 collected in July 2011. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local hotel collections between August and July 2011 were: Bristol, 164.5 percent; West Greenwich, 141.7 percent; Newport, 64.5 percent; Coventry, 41.0 percent; and Smithfield, 25.5 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local hotel collections between August and July 2011 were: Portsmouth, -19.5 percent; Little Compton, -15.6 percent; East Providence, -15.0 percent; Westerly, -14.3 percent; and Richmond, -14.0 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local hotel tax collections between August and July 2011 were: Newport, \$49,773; Providence, \$3,874; West Greenwich, \$2,648; Warwick, \$1,515; and Coventry, \$1,362. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local hotel tax collections between August and July 2011 were: Westerly, -\$5,702; Middletown, -\$1,053; East Providence, -\$256; Portsmouth, -\$196; and Little Compton, -\$185.

Analysis of Year-over-Year Collections by Month

On a statewide basis, August 2011 local hotel tax collections totaled \$405,091 or 4.8 percent more than the \$386,564 collected in August 2010. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local hotel collections between August 2011 and August 2010 were:

Johnston, 1,460.8 percent; North Kingstown, 183.7 percent; Portsmouth, 50.0 percent; Smithfield, 27.8 percent; and Middletown, 19.1 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local hotel collections between August 2011 and August 2010 were: Little Compton, -25.6 percent; Westerly, -22.0 percent; Charlestown, -20.2 percent; Richmond, -12.5 percent; and Narragansett, -8.6 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local hotel tax collections between August 2011 and August 2010 were: Newport, \$10,158; Middletown, \$7,372; Providence, \$2,848; Warwick, \$2,707; and North Kingstown, \$2,572. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local hotel tax collections between August 2011 and August 2010 were: Westerly, -\$9,594; Narragansett, -\$790; Charlestown, -\$623; Little Compton, -\$346; and New Shoreham, -\$334.

Analysis of Fiscal Year-to-Date Collections through August

On a statewide basis, fiscal year-to-date August 2011 local hotel tax collections totaled \$753,046 or 2.7 percent more than the \$733,046 collected in fiscal year-to-date August 2010. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date August 2011 and fiscal year-to-date August 2010 were: North Kingstown, 210.2 percent; Johnston, 100.6 percent; Portsmouth, 25.2 percent; Jamestown, 15.5 percent; and East Providence, 13.5 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local hotel collections between fiscal year-to-date August 2011 and fiscal year-to-date August 2010 were: East Greenwich, -83.0 percent; Little Compton, -38.4 percent; North Smithfield, -26.5 percent; Bristol, -19.6 percent; and West Greenwich, -17.7 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date August 2011 and fiscal year-to-date August 2010 were: Middletown, \$9,003; Newport, \$7,960; North Kingstown, \$5,319; Westerly, \$3,913; and Warwick, \$2,937. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date August 2011 and fiscal year-to-date August 2010 were: Providence, -\$6,411; West Greenwich, -\$1,372; Little Compton, -\$1,370; Narragansett, -\$1,235; and Charlestown, -\$848.
