## State of Rhode Island Monthly Hotel Report FY 2012 1.0 Percent Local Collections February 2012

Beginning in June 2010, the Rhode Island Department of Revenue will issue a report on the collection and distribution of the 1.0 percent local Hotel Tax. The report is meant to be descriptive and does not purport to project or assess the collection of the 1.0 percent local Hotel Tax. The report will provide data, by municipality, on the month-to-month, the year-over-year, and the fiscal year-to-date collections. A discussion of the municipalities with the largest and smallest percentage changes in these three measures will be included in the body of the report.

### **Analysis of Month-to-Month Collections**

On a statewide basis, February 2012 local hotel collections totaled \$124,162 or 3.8 percent more than the \$119,647 collected in January 2012. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local hotel collections between February and January 2012 were: Bristol, 1,147.6 percent; East Greenwich, 357.9 percent; Narragansett, 122.5 percent; New Shoreham, 121.8 percent; and Glocester, 121.1 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local hotel collections between February and January 2012 were: Newport, -53.7 percent; East Providence, -15.5 percent; Warwick, -8.1 percent; Portsmouth, -4.7 percent; and Smithfield, -2.9 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local hotel tax collections between February and January 2012 were: Providence, \$16,640; Middletown, \$1,234; West Warwick, \$873; Westerly, \$833; and Bristol, \$531. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local hotel tax collections between February and January 2012 were: Newport, -\$15,960; Warwick, -\$2,001; East Providence, -\$195; Smithfield, -\$97; and Little Compton, -\$9.

#### Analysis of Year-over-Year Collections by Month

On a statewide basis, February 2012 local hotel tax collections totaled \$124,162 or 19.1 percent more than the \$104,258 collected in February 2011. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local hotel collections between February 2012 and February 2011 were: North Kingstown, 1,039.4 percent; New Shoreham, 257.8 percent; Portsmouth, 239.5 percent;

Glocester, 119.7 percent; and Scituate, 79.9 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local hotel collections between February 2012 and February 2011 were: Johnston, -53.2 percent; Pawtucket, -10.2 percent; Narragansett, -9.1 percent; Coventry, -8.2 percent; and Cranston, -2.3 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local hotel tax collections between February 2012 and February 2011 were: Providence, \$13,006; Middletown, \$1,428; North Kingstown, \$1,099; Westerly, \$901; and West Greenwich, \$747. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local hotel tax collections between February 2012 and February 2011 were: Johnston, -\$261; Coventry, -\$150; Pawtucket, -\$108; Narragansett, -\$28; and South Kingstown, -\$22.

### Analysis of Fiscal Year-to-Date Collections through February

On a statewide basis, fiscal year-to-date February 2012 local hotel tax collections totaled \$1.97 million or 7.8 percent more than the \$1.83 million collected in fiscal year-to-date February 2011. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date February 2012 and fiscal year-to-date February 2011 were: North Kingstown, 342.3 percent; Cranston, 39.8 percent; Portsmouth, 25.8 percent; Woonsocket, 24.0 percent; and North Smithfield, 22.6 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local hotel collections between fiscal year-to-date February 2012 and fiscal year-to-date February 2011 were: Foster, -96.0 percent; Little Compton, -32.2 percent; West Warwick, -7.1 percent; Charlestown, -4.7 percent; and Scituate, -2.8 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date February 2012 and fiscal year-to-date February 2011 were: Newport, \$37,497; Middletown, \$21,794; Warwick, \$20,623; Providence, \$19,440; and North Kingstown, \$14,517. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date February 2012 and fiscal year-to-date February 2011 were: West Warwick, -\$1,998; Little Compton, -\$1,505; New Shoreham, -\$355; Charlestown, -\$345; and Bristol, -\$104.
