State of Rhode Island Monthly Hotel Report FY 2013 1.0 Percent Local Collections December 2012

Beginning in June 2010, the Rhode Island Department of Revenue will issue a report on the collection and distribution of the 1.0 percent local Hotel Tax. The report is meant to be descriptive and does not purport to project or assess the collection of the 1.0 percent local Hotel Tax. The report will provide data, by municipality, on the month-to-month, the year-over-year, and the fiscal year-to-date collections. A discussion of the municipalities with the largest and smallest percentage changes in these three measures will be included in the body of the report.

Analysis of Month-to-Month Collections

On a statewide basis, December 2012 local hotel tax collections totaled \$134,233, or 36.0 percent less than the \$209,696 collected in November 2012. The three communities with a percentage increase in local hotel tax collections between December 2012 and November 2012 were: Westerly, 31.2 percent; Richmond, 31.1 percent; and East Greenwich, 28.0 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decreases in local hotel tax collections between December 2012 and November 2012 were: North Smithfield, -100.0 percent; Johnston, -94.5 percent; Glocester, -71.1 percent; Narragansett, -69.2 percent; and Newport, -56.4 percent.

The three communities with a nominal increase in local hotel tax collections between December 2012 and November 2012 were: Westerly, \$1,172; Richmond, \$23; and East Greenwich, \$3. The five communities with the largest nominal decreases in local hotel tax collections between December 2012 and November 2012: Newport, -\$45,506; Providence, -\$17,878; Warwick, -\$4,163; Smithfield, -\$1,209; and Middletown, -\$1,102.

Analysis of Year-over-Year Collections by Month

On a statewide basis, December 2012 local hotel tax collections totaled \$134,233, or 8.6 percent more than the \$123,562 collected in December 2011. The five communities with the largest percentage increases in local hotel tax collections between December 2012 and December 2011

were: Portsmouth, 97.2 percent; Westerly, 66.5 percent; North Kingstown, 61.6 percent; New Shoreham, 47.7 percent; and East Providence, 30.6 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decreases in local hotel tax collections between December 2012 and December 2011 were: Little Compton and North Smithfield, -100.0 percent; Narragansett, -71.1 percent; Glocester, -50.6 percent; and Coventry, -38.4 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increases in local hotel tax collections between December 2012 and December 2011 were: Providence, \$5,666; Warwick, \$4,722; Westerly, \$1,966; North Kingstown, \$677; and Woonsocket, \$368. The five communities with the largest nominal decreases in local hotel tax collections between December 2012 and December 2011 were: Smithfield, -\$737; Coventry, -\$654; Middletown, -\$561; Narragansett, -\$549; and Bristol, -\$382.

Analysis of Fiscal Year-to-Date Collections through December

On a statewide basis, fiscal year-to-date December 2012 local hotel tax collections totaled \$1.83 million, or 6.2 percent more than the \$1.73 million collected in fiscal year-to-date December 2011. The five communities with the largest percentage increases in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date December 2012 and fiscal year-to-date December 2011 were: North Smithfield, 60.3 percent; East Greenwich, 53.8 percent; Woonsocket, 47.0 percent; West Greenwich, 19.2 percent; and North Kingstown, 14.4 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decreases in local hotel collections between fiscal year-to-date December 2012 and fiscal year-to-date December 2011 were: Foster, -100.0 percent; Coventry, -31.8 percent; Little Compton, -23.1 percent; Scituate, -15.8 percent; and West Warwick, -14.7 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increases in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date December 2012 and fiscal year-to-date December 2011 were: Providence, \$36,083; Newport, \$33,963; Warwick, \$15,383; Westerly, \$11,173; and New Shoreham, \$8,226. The five communities with the largest nominal decreases in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date December 2012 and fiscal year-to-date December 2011 were: Coventry, -\$6,290; West Warwick, -\$3,439; Smithfield, -\$1,118; Middletown, -\$789; and Little Compton, -\$730.
