State of Rhode Island Monthly Hotel Report FY 2013 1.0 Percent Local Collections July 2012

Beginning in June 2010, the Rhode Island Department of Revenue will issue a report on the collection and distribution of the 1.0 percent local Hotel Tax. The report is meant to be descriptive and does not purport to project or assess the collection of the 1.0 percent local Hotel Tax. The report will provide data, by municipality, on the month-to-month, the year-over-year, and the fiscal year-to-date collections. A discussion of the municipalities with the largest and smallest percentage changes in these three measures will be included in the body of the report.

Analysis of Month-to-Month Collections

On a statewide basis, July 2012 1.0 percent local hotel tax collections totaled \$394,859, or 31.2 percent more than the \$301,018 collected in June 2012. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in 1.0 percent local hotel tax collections between July 2012 and June 2012 were: Johnston, 3,053.7 percent; Westerly, 143.4 percent; New Shoreham, 124.8 percent; Narragansett, 111.6 percent; and Bristol, 107.5 percent. The three communities with a percentage decrease in 1.0 percent local hotel collections between July 2012 and June 2012 were: North Smithfield, -38.8 percent; Providence, -16.8 percent; and Scituate, -11.3 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in 1.0 percent local hotel tax collections between June 2012 and May 2012 were: Newport, \$35,036; Westerly, \$27,353; New Shoreham, \$17,679; Middletown, \$11,111; and Narragansett, \$4,728. The three communities with a nominal decrease in 1.0 percent local hotel tax collections between July 2012 and June 2012 were: Providence, -\$14,440; North Smithfield, -\$59; and Scituate, -\$20.

Analysis of Year-over-Year Collections by Month

On a statewide basis, July 2012 1.0 percent local hotel tax collections totaled \$394,859, or 13.5 percent more than the \$347,955 collected in July 2011. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in 1.0 percent local hotel tax collections between July 2012 and July 2011 were: Bristol, 313.7 percent; West Greenwich, 146.6 percent; Johnston, 55.3 percent;

Woonsocket, 51.5 percent; and Pawtucket, 34.8 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in 1.0 percent local hotel tax collections between July 2012 and July 2011 were: Scituate, -15.8 percent; Charlestown, -13.0 percent; Richmond, -12.5 percent; Jamestown, -10.9 percent; and Cranston, -10.7 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in 1.0 percent local hotel tax collections between July 2012 and July 2011 were: Newport, \$17,916; Providence, \$6,773; Westerly, \$6,693; Warwick, \$4,421; and West Greenwich, \$2,740. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in 1.0 percent local hotel tax collections between July 2012 and July 2011 were: Middletown, -\$1,059; West Warwick, -\$414; Coventry, -\$320; Charlestown, -\$302; and Jamestown, -\$93.

Analysis of Fiscal Year-to-Date Collections through June

In the first month of a fiscal year the analysis of fiscal year-to-date collections through the first month of the fiscal year is the same as the analysis of year-over-year collections by month. Thus, no additional analysis on the 1.0 percent local hotel tax is possible at this time.
