### State of Rhode Island Monthly Hotel Report FY 2013 1.0 Percent Local Collections March 2013

Beginning in June 2010, the Rhode Island Department of Revenue will issue a report on the collection and distribution of the 1.0 percent local hotel tax. The report is meant to be descriptive and does not purport to project or assess the collection of the 1.0 percent local hotel tax. The report will provide data, by municipality, on the month-to-month, the year-over-year, and the fiscal year-to-date collections. A discussion of the municipalities with the largest and smallest percentage changes in these three measures will be included in the body of the report.

#### **Analysis of Month-to-Month Collections**

On a statewide basis, March 2013 local hotel tax collections totaled \$148,482, or 14.0 percent more than the \$130,278 collected in February 2013. The five communities with the largest percentage increases in local hotel tax collections between March 2013 and February 2013 were: New Shoreham, 140.5 percent; Glocester, 67.7 percent; Narragansett, 61.4 percent; Westerly, 61.2 percent; and East Greenwich, 56.9 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decreases in local hotel tax collections between March 2013 and February 2013 were: Johnston, -94.1 percent; Little Compton, -86.5 percent; Coventry, -54.9 percent; North Smithfield, -43.8 percent; and Richmond, -42.2 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increases in local hotel tax collections between March 2013 and February 2013 were: Providence, \$12,094; Newport, \$4,322; Middletown, \$1,970; Westerly, \$1,280; and Warwick, \$850. The five communities with the largest nominal decreases in local hotel tax collections between March 2013 and February 2013: Coventry, -\$1,536; Little Compton, -\$1,299; West Warwick, -\$290; Johnston, -\$231; and East Providence, -\$121.

#### Analysis of Year-over-Year Collections by Month

On a statewide basis, March 2013 local hotel tax collections totaled \$148,482, or 3.6 percent more than the \$143,365 collected in March 2012. The five communities with the largest percentage increases in local hotel tax collections between March 2013 and March 2012 were: Glocester, 115.9 percent; New Shoreham, 39.7 percent; Westerly, 37.5 percent; East Greenwich, 33.7 percent; and Narragansett, 29.9 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decreases in local hotel tax collections between March 2013 and March 2012 were: Johnston, -95.0 percent; North Smithfield, -38.6 percent; Coventry, -26.9 percent; Woonsocket, -23.3 percent; and West Greenwich, -15.3 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increases in local hotel tax collections between March 2013 and March 2012 were: Warwick, \$3,628; Providence, \$3,411; Westerly, \$919; South Kingstown, \$374; and Little Compton, \$203. The five communities with the largest nominal decreases in local hotel tax collections between March 2013 and March 2012 were: Middletown, -\$863; Newport, -\$801; Woonsocket, -\$563; Coventry, -\$466; and West Greenwich, -\$454.

#### Analysis of Fiscal Year-to-Date Collections through December

On a statewide basis, fiscal year-to-date March 2013 local hotel tax collections totaled \$2.25 million, or 6.2 percent more than the \$2.11 million collected in fiscal year-to-date March 2012. The five communities with the largest percentage increases in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date March 2013 and fiscal year-to-date March 2012 were: East Greenwich, 51.3 percent; North Smithfield, 41.2 percent; Woonsocket, 33.0 percent; Little Compton, 31.2 percent; and Bristol, 15.9 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decreases in local hotel collections between fiscal year-to-date March 2013 and fiscal year-to-date March 2012 were: Coventry, -20.2 percent; Johnston, -12.7 percent; Scituate, -11.2 percent; Glocester, -7.0 percent; and West Warwick, -6.6 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increases in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date March 2013 and fiscal year-to-date March 2012 were: Providence, \$40,530; Newport, \$36,827; Warwick, \$24,087; Westerly, \$12,384; and New Shoreham, \$7,961. The five communities with the largest nominal decreases in local hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date March 2013 and fiscal year-to-date March 2012 were: Coventry, -\$4,984; West Warwick, -\$1,871; Middletown, -\$1,712; Smithfield, -\$1,282; and Charlestown, -\$403.
