State of Rhode Island Monthly Meal and Beverage Report FY 2011 1.0 Percent Local Collections March 2011

Beginning in June 2010, the Rhode Island Department of Revenue will issue a report on the collection and distribution of the 1.0 percent local Meal and Beverage Tax. The report is meant to be descriptive and does not purport to project or assess the collection of the 1.0 percent local Meals and Beverage Tax. The report will provide data, by municipality, on the month-to-month, the year-over-year, and the fiscal year-to-date collections. A discussion of the municipalities with the largest and smallest percentage changes in these three measures will be included in the body of the report.

Analysis of Month-to-Month Collections

On a statewide basis, March 2011 local meal and beverage tax collections totaled \$1.47 million or 8.7 percent more than the \$1.35 million collected in February 2011. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local meal and beverage tax collections between March 2011 and February 2011 were: New Shoreham, 525.4 percent; Foster, 64.3 percent; Charlestown, 58.9 percent; Glocester, 47.5 percent; and West Greenwich, 33.5 percent. The four communities with a percentage decrease in local meal and beverage tax collections between March 2011 and February 2011 were: Westerly, -11.3 percent; Bristol, -6.4 percent; North Kingstown, -5.2 percent; and Little Compton, -4.4 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local meals and beverage tax collections between March 2011 and February 2011 were: Cranston, \$14,088; Warwick, \$14,009; Providence, \$13,445; Smithfield, \$9,949; and South Kingstown, \$6,927. The four communities with a nominal decrease in local meals and beverage tax collections between March 2011 and February 2011 were: Westerly, -\$4,192; North Kingstown, -\$1,636; Bristol, -\$1,264; and Little Compton, -\$48.

Analysis of Year-over-Year Collections by Month

On a statewide basis, March 2011 local meal and beverage tax collections totaled \$1.47 million or 1.3 percent less than the \$1.49 million collected in March 2010. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local meal and beverage tax collections between March 2011 and March 2010 were: New Shoreham, 63.6 percent; Charlestown, 34.3 percent; Glocester, 22.3 percent; Tiverton, 16.1 percent; and Richmond, 13.3 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local meal and beverage tax collections between March 2011 and March 2010 were: Little Compton, -23.8 percent; Foster, -22.3 percent; Bristol, -21.6 percent; Scituate, -19.3 percent; and West Warwick, -14.7 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local meals and beverage tax collections between March 2011 and March 2010 were: Cranston, \$6,395; Lincoln, \$4,239; Smithfield, \$4,088; Cumberland, \$3,083; and South Kingstown, \$2,820. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local meals and beverage tax collections between March 2011 and March 2010 were: Providence, -\$12,684; Bristol, -\$5,131; Woonsocket, -\$4,028; West Warwick, -\$4,001; and Westerly, -\$3,976.

Analysis of Fiscal Year-to-Date Collections through March

On a statewide basis, fiscal year-to-date 2011 local meal and beverage tax collections totaled \$14.29 million or 2.9 percent more than the \$13.89 million collected through fiscal year-to-date March 2010. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local meal and beverage tax collections between fiscal year-to-date March 2011 and fiscal year-to-date March 2010 were: Johnston, 11.7 percent; Central Falls, 11.0 percent; Richmond, 10.5 percent; and Bristol and Glocester, 10.2 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local meal and beverage tax collections between fiscal year-to-date March 2011 and fiscal year-to-date March 2010 were: Foster, -16.8 percent; Little Compton, -14.9 percent; Hopkinton, -6.4 percent; and North Providence and West Warwick, -4.9 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local meals and beverage tax collections between fiscal year-to-date March 2011 and fiscal year-to-date March 2010 were: Newport, \$98,384; Providence, \$97,575; Johnston, \$36,397; Cranston, \$35,544; and Westerly, \$33,421;. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local meals and beverage tax collections between fiscal year-to-date March 2011 and fiscal year-to-date March 2010 were: Warwick, -\$18,407; North Providence, -\$12,587; West Warwick, -\$11,957; Woonsocket, -\$7,588; and Narragansett, -\$5,203.
