## State of Rhode Island Monthly Meal and Beverage Report FY 2012 1.0 Percent Local Collections September 2011

Beginning in June 2010, the Rhode Island Department of Revenue will issue a report on the collection and distribution of the 1.0 percent local Meal and Beverage Tax. The report is meant to be descriptive and does not purport to project or assess the collection of the 1.0 percent local Meals and Beverage Tax. The report will provide data, by municipality, on the month-to-month, the year-over-year, and the fiscal year-to-date collections. A discussion of the municipalities with the largest and smallest percentage changes in these three measures will be included in the body of the report.

### **Analysis of Month-to-Month Collections**

On a statewide basis, September 2011 local meal and beverage tax collections totaled \$1.86 million or 1.1 percent less than the \$1.88 million collected in August 2011. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local meal and beverage collections between September and August 2011 were: Portsmouth, 40.4 percent; Exeter, 37.7 percent; Hopkinton, 26.1 percent; Glocester, 19.1 percent; and Providence, 17.8 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local meal and beverage collections between September and August 2011 were: New Shoreham, -64.0 percent; Narragansett, -37.3 percent; Westerly, -29.3 percent; Charlestown, -21.8 percent; and Jamestown, -16.4 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local meals and beverage tax collections between September and August 2011 were: Providence, \$58,396; Warwick, \$10,432; Lincoln, \$7,355; Portsmouth, \$5,776; and East Providence, \$5,581. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local meals and beverage tax collections between September and August 2011 were: New Shoreham, -\$43,367; Narragansett, -\$29,146; Westerly, -\$25,884; South Kingstown, -\$8,468; and Cranston, -\$5,207.

#### Analysis of Year-over-Year Collections by Month

On a statewide basis, September 2011 local meal and beverage tax collections totaled \$1.86 million or 11.6 percent more than the \$1.67 million collected in September 2010. The five

communities with the largest percentage increase in local meal and beverage collections between September 2011 and September 2010 were: Little Compton, 62.2 percent; Warren, 48.0 percent; Exeter, 32.7 percent; Charlestown, 23.1 percent; and Glocester, 21.3 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local meal and beverage collections between September 2011 and September 2010 were: West Greenwich, -11.4 percent; Barrington, -8.6 percent; Burrillville, -3.8 percent; Foster, -3.2 percent; and North Providence, -3.1 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local meals and beverage tax collections between September 2011 and September 2010 were: Providence, \$50,685; Warwick, \$34,600; Newport, \$30,159; Westerly, \$9,893; and Smithfield, \$8,286. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local meals and beverage tax collections between September 2011 and September 2010 were: West Greenwich, -\$1,057; Woonsocket, -\$979; Barrington, -\$973; North Providence, -\$863; and Middletown, -\$678.

### Analysis of Fiscal Year-to-Date Collections through September

On a statewide basis, fiscal year-to-date 2011 local meal and beverage tax collections totaled \$5.93 million or 4.6 percent more than the \$5.67 million collected through fiscal year-to-date September 2010. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local meal and beverage tax collections between fiscal year-to-date September 2011 and fiscal year-to-date September 2010 were: Warren, 31.8 percent; Smithfield, 13.1 percent; Charlestown and Warwick, 10.6 percent; and Glocester, 9.4 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local meal and beverage tax collections between fiscal year-to-date September 2011 and fiscal year-to-date September 2010 were: Bristol, -17.3 percent; Hopkinton, -15.4 percent; Foster, -14.9 percent; West Greenwich, -12.2 percent; and Portsmouth, -11.7 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local meal and beverage tax collections between fiscal year-to-date September 2011 and fiscal year-to-date September 2010 were: Providence, \$81,148; Warwick, \$57,294; Newport, \$41,327; Cranston, \$18,687; and Warren, \$16,567. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local meal and beverage tax collections between fiscal year-to-date September 2011 and fiscal year-to-date September 2010 were: Bristol, -\$17,752; Portsmouth, -\$6,828; West Warwick, -\$6,509; Pawtucket, -\$4,082; and West Greenwich, -\$3,602.
