State of Rhode Island Monthly Meal and Beverage Report FY 2013 1.0 Percent Local Collections November 2012

Beginning in June 2010, the Rhode Island Department of Revenue will issue a report on the collection and distribution of the 1.0 percent local Meal and Beverage Tax. The report is meant to be descriptive and does not purport to project or assess the collection of the 1.0 percent local Meals and Beverage Tax. The report will provide data by municipality, on the month-to-month, the year-over-year, and the fiscal year-to-date collections. A discussion of the municipalities with the largest and smallest percentage changes in these three measures will be included in the body of the report.

Analysis of Month-to-Month Collections

On a statewide basis, November 2012 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections totaled \$1.59 million, or 10.4 percent less than the \$1.77 million collected in October 2012. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between November 2012 and October 2012 were: Glocester, 47.4 percent; North Providence, 29.7 percent; Pawtucket, 10.7 percent; Bristol, 7.4 percent; and Cranston, 5.6 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between November 2012 and October 2012 were: New Shoreham, -70.9 percent; Foster, -61.4 percent; Little Compton, -41.2 percent; Jamestown, -39.5 percent; and Charlestown, -38.7 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between November 2012 and October 2012 were: North Providence, \$8,186; Cranston, \$6,735; Pawtucket, \$5,434; Glocester, \$2,600; and Bristol, \$2,094. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between November 2012 and October 2012 were: Newport, -\$56,802; Providence, -\$47,077; Warwick, \$26,805; Middletown, -\$8,223; and Narragansett, -\$7,273.

Analysis of Year-over-Year Collections by Month

On a statewide basis, November 2012 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections totaled \$1.59 million, or 2.0 percent more than the \$1.56 million collected in November 2011. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between November 2012 and November 2011 were: Richmond, 28.0 percent; Portsmouth, 25.4 percent, Glocester, 20.8 percent; Westerly, 19.9 percent; and Burrillville, 19.3 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between November 2012 and November 2011 were: Little Compton, -33.2 percent; Exeter, -23.5 percent; New Shoreham, -23.2 percent; Tiverton, -17.9 percent; and Middletown, -14.4 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between November 2012 and November 2011 were: Cranston, \$8,265; Westerly, \$7,801; South Kingstown, \$7,190; North Providence, \$4,791; and Providence, \$4,662. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between November 2012 and November 2011 were: Middletown, -\$5,914; Warwick, -\$5,329; West Warwick, -\$3,699; Tiverton, -\$2,957; and Lincoln, -\$2,937.

Analysis of Fiscal Year-to-Date Collections through November

The Division of Taxation experienced a delay in processing and reconciling the local meals and beverage tax data for June 2012. An unknown number of July 2012 meals and beverage tax returns may have been included in the meals and beverage tax data for June 2012. As a result, the July 2012 meals and beverage tax data may have been understated, which means the year-to-date meals and beverage tax data is also understated. Insufficient information was available to estimate the amount of July 2012 meals and beverage tax data that may have been included in the June 2012 meals and beverage tax data.

On a statewide basis, fiscal year-to-date November 2012 local meal and beverage tax collections totaled \$9.32 million, or 1.5 percent more than the \$9.19 million collected through fiscal year-to-date November 2011. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between fiscal year-to-date November 2012 and fiscal year-to-date November 2011 were: Little Compton, 22.8 percent; Glocester, 15.9 percent; Hopkinton, 14.8 percent; Bristol, 12.3 percent; and West Greenwich, 10.9 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between fiscal year-to-date November 2012 and fiscal year-to-date November 2011 were: Warren, -10.1 percent; Pawtucket, -6.6 percent; Central Falls, -5.8 percent; Charlestown, -5.2 percent; and Scituate, -5.0 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between fiscal year-to-date November 2012 and fiscal year-to-date November 2011 were: Providence, \$62,391; South Kingstown, \$23,885; Bristol \$17,640; East Greenwich, \$17,607; and North Kingstown, \$9,117. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease

in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between fiscal year-to-date November 2012 and fiscal year-to-date November 2011 were: Warwick, -\$31,158; Pawtucket, -\$18,586; Warren, -\$11,049; Narragansett, -\$8,811; and Lincoln, -\$6,232.
