State of Rhode Island Monthly Meal and Beverage Report FY 2013 1.0 Percent Local Collections March 2013

Beginning in June 2010, the Rhode Island Department of Revenue will issue a report on the collection and distribution of the 1.0 percent local Meal and Beverage Tax. The report is meant to be descriptive and does not purport to project or assess the collection of the 1.0 percent local Meals and Beverage Tax. The report will provide data by municipality, on the month-to-month, the year-over-year, and the fiscal year-to-date collections. A discussion of the municipalities with the largest and smallest percentage changes in these three measures will be included in the body of the report.

Analysis of Month-to-Month Collections

On a statewide basis, March 2013 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections totaled \$1.68 million, or 21.6 percent more than the \$1.38 million collected in February 2013. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between March 2013 and February 2013 were: New Shoreham, 99.6 percent; Foster, 81.5 percent; North Smithfield, 50.4 percent; Westerly, 44.2 percent; and Newport, 43.3 percent. The five communities with a percentage decrease in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between March 2013 and February 2013 were: Scituate, -34.4 percent; Hopkinton, -18.9 percent; Glocester, -8.8 percent; East Greenwich, -1.0 percent; and Cranston, -0.5 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between March 2013 and February 2013 were: Providence, \$80,129; Newport, \$28,640; Warwick, \$26,135; Lincoln, \$13,369; and Middletown, \$13,127. The five communities with a nominal decrease in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between March 2013 and February 2013 were: Scituate, -\$2,693; Hopkinton, -\$809; Cranston, -\$617; Glocester, -\$516; and East Greenwich, -\$414.

Analysis of Year-over-Year Collections by Month

On a statewide basis, March 2013 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections totaled \$1.68 million, or 0.5 percent more than the \$1.67 million collected in March 2012. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between March 2013 and March 2012 were: Charlestown, 42.5 percent; New Shoreham; 30.9 percent; Foster, 27.6 percent; Burrillville, 22.0 percent; and Scituate, 18.1 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between March 2013 and March 2012 were: Jamestown, -26.5 percent; Hopkinton, -21.3 percent; Bristol, -11.8 percent; Cranston, -8.1 percent; and Coventry, -7.2 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between March 2013 and March 2012 were: Warwick, \$6,274; West Warwick, \$3,494; Narragansett, \$3,240; Burrillville, \$2,966; and East Providence, \$2,610. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between March 2013 and March 2012 were: Cranston, -\$10,534; Providence, -\$6,411; Bristol, -\$3,029; Coventry, -\$2,459; and Newport, -\$2,196.

Analysis of Fiscal Year-to-Date Collections through February

The Division of Taxation experienced a delay in processing and reconciling the local meals and beverage tax data for June 2012. An unknown number of July 2012 meals and beverage tax returns may have been included in the meals and beverage tax data for June 2012. As a result, the July 2012 meals and beverage tax data may have been understated, which means the year-to-date meals and beverage tax data is also understated. Insufficient information was available to estimate the amount of July 2012 meals and beverage tax data that may have been included in the June 2012 meals and beverage tax data.

On a statewide basis, fiscal year-to-date March 2013 local meal and beverage tax collections totaled \$15.47 million, or 2.0 percent more than the \$15.17 million collected through fiscal year-to-date March 2012. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between fiscal year-to-date March 2013 and fiscal year-to-date March 2012 were: Little Compton, 24.4 percent; Burrillville, 14.2 percent; Glocester, 12.0 percent; Richmond, 8.9 percent; and East Greenwich, 8.0 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between fiscal year-to-date March 2013 and fiscal year-to-date March 2012 were: Warren, -6.8 percent; Central Falls, -4.5 percent; Coventry, -3.9 percent; Pawtucket, -3.1 percent; and Charlestown, -2.7 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in 1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between fiscal year-to-date March 2013 and fiscal year-to-date March 2012 were: Providence, \$118,897; East Greenwich, \$27,053; South Kingstown, \$24,907; East Providence, \$21,055; and Burrillville, \$17,730. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in

1.0 percent local meal and beverage tax collections between fiscal year-to-date March 2013 and fiscal year-to-date March 2012 were: Pawtucket, -\$14,787; Warren, -\$11,892; Coventry, -\$10,413; Warwick, -\$8,378; and Johnston, -\$7,642.
